Meghan has helped five different veterans on 15 different matters and has spent over 100 hours on Military Matters cases – and counting. Meghan was able to help a veteran who was charged with a minimum 2-year prison sentence get a reduced charge and probation. Another client was placed in a diversion program instead of getting a criminal conviction, and on top of that, she was able to save him the expense of court fees and fines. Handling mainly criminal matters, there isn't a case that Meghan isn't willing to take on. As a former Jackson County Prosecutor, she knew she could utilize her skills to help veterans in the Military Matters program. Upon learning that Military Matters has a need for criminal defense attorneys, Meghan did not think twice about signing up to volunteer – she simply wanted to help veterans.
